Third Grade Visits Cabrini

The third grade went on a class trip to Cabrini Nursing Home on December 5th. They sang carols for the residents there, including Deck the Halls, Away in a Manger, Joy to the World, Jingle Bells, Jingle Bell Rock, Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer, and many others. They also handed out blankets and cards to the residents, which were enjoyed by all.

We interviewed two residents at Cabrini and the Director of Recreation there. The first resident, Sister Golden, entered the convent in 1943, was a principal in Brooklyn, and worked as a principal at three different schools-Good Counsel Academy, Sacred Heart in Hartsdale, and Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Elmsford. When asked if she liked the childrens' company she responded, "I love them because they bring new life to all here."

We also interviewed Sister Bernadette. She was a teacher in the Bronx who worked at Saint Francis of Rome. She taught many grades including 5th and 8th grades. We asked her what she thought of St. Joseph School coming to visit, and she said, "It's a beautiful treat, and I love you folks." We also talked to Sheri Gottlielo, the Director of Recreation at Cabrini. She told us how the residents respond to the kids and she said, "They love it! Their faces light up! Even though some of them might not be able to show emotion, they get happy!"

We asked two 3rd graders, Lindsay Lugano and Thomas Encke how they felt about going to sing for the elderly residents. Lindsay said that she loved seeing smiles on people's faces, and Thomas said that it was so fun, and he especially enjoyed singing!

St. Joseph School loves giving back to the community especially during this time of year! It was a great experience, and the 3rd graders loved making people smile and making their day happy.

How to make Bread Pudding

2 tablespoons of melted butter

34 cup of white sugar

½ cup of raisins (optional)

1 teaspoon of ground cinnamon

4 eggs, beaten

1 teaspoon of vanilla extract

Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Break bread into small pieces and put into an 8 inch square baking pan. Drizzle melted butter or margarine over bread. If desired, sprinkle with raisins.

In a medium mixing bowl, combine eggs, milk, sugar, cinnamon, and vanilla. Beat until well mixed. Pour over bread, and lightly push down with a fork until bread is covered and soaking up the egg mixture.

Bake in the preheated oven for 45 minutes.

Christmas Treat Recipes

White Chocolate Christmas Bark

Ingredients:

1/2 package of saltines

2 packages white chocolate chips

1 tbsp vegetable oil

1 1/2 cups Andes peppermint baking chips

Directions:

- 1. Spread saltines out on parchment paper.
- 2. Using a double boiler, melt white chocolate chips, adding oil as it begins to melt to prevent clumping.
- 3. When chocolate is melted, pour over saltines. Spread if needed to cover them all.
- 4. Pour Andes baking chips over melted chocolate.
- 5. Optional- sprinkle sea salt over candy.
- 6. Let cool in refrigerator.
- 7. When cold, cut and serve!

Candy Cane Oreo Cookie Bars

Ingredients: 1 tsp vanilla extract
For the Cookie Base: 2 cups all purpose flour

1 cup unsalted butter, softened
1/2 cup dark chocolate unsweetened

1 cup granulated sugar cocoa powder 1/2 cup light brown sugar 1 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp kosher salt
2 eggs
15 Candy Cane Oreos, crushed
1 1/2 cup red & green chocolate chips

For the Topping:

1 can (14 oz) sweetened condensed milk

2 tbsp unsalted butter

12 oz Green and Black's White Chocolate Bars

Directions:

- 1. Beat butter and sugars until creamy, using a mixer. Add in salt, eggs and vanilla. Slowly add flour, baking soda and cocoa, until combined completely. Fold in crushed Oreos and morsels (batter will be thick).
- 2. Press into a parchment paper lined 15x10x1 baking sheet. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 15- 20 minutes, until soft in center and cooked on outside (adjust according to own oven). Remove from oven (will set while cooling).
- 3. While baking, heat condensed milk and butter in a small saucepan on medium heat. Stirring constantly with a whisk, add white chocolate to warm milk mixture. Remove from heat and stir until smooth (about 2 minutes).
- 4. Pour over cooked cookie bars and sprinkle immediately with crushed candy canes. Allow to set (about 30 minutes). Cut and enjoy!
